DESCRIPTION

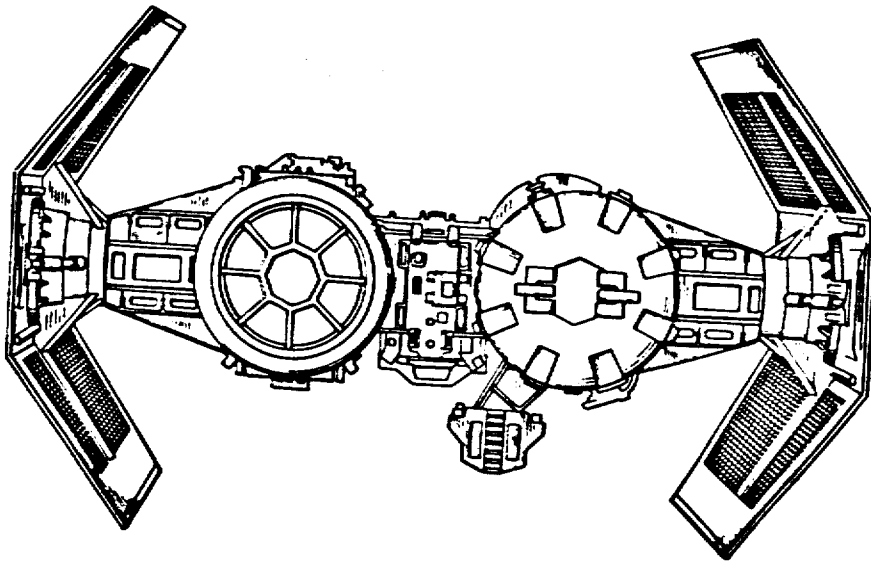
FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a toy space vehicle illustrating our new design;

FIG. 5 is a side perspective view thereof.



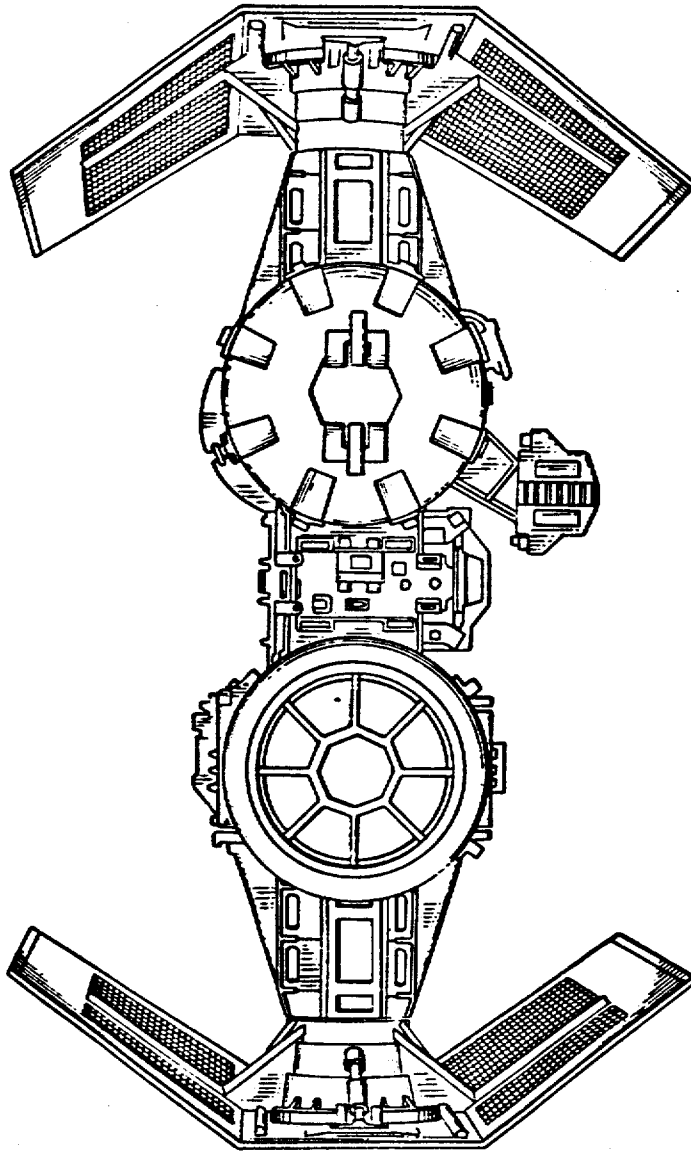

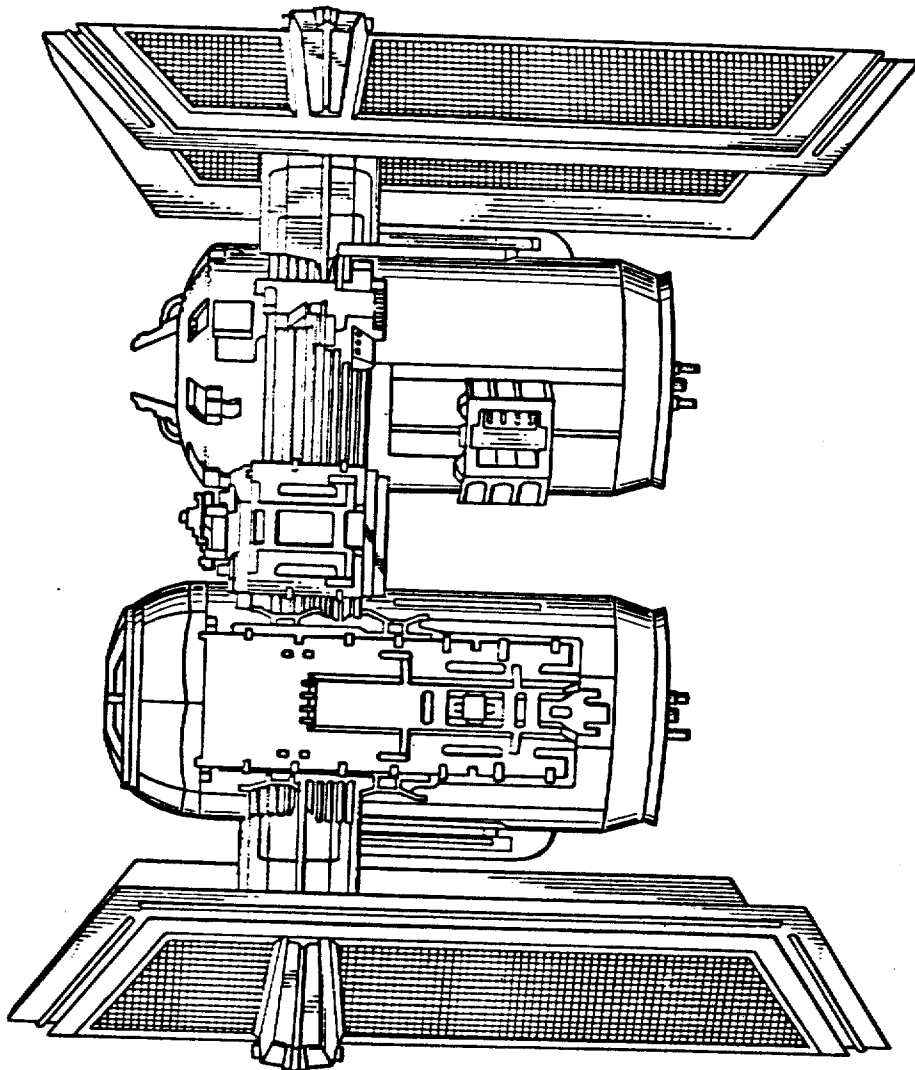

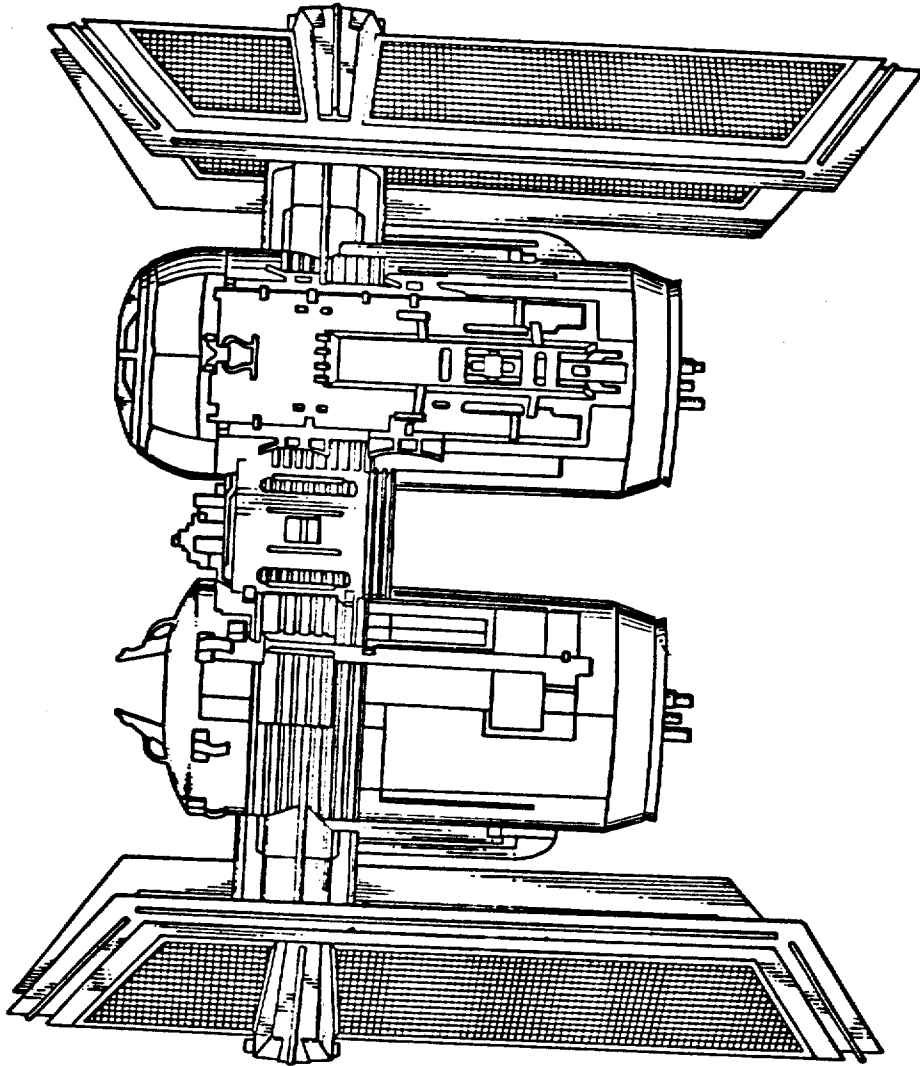

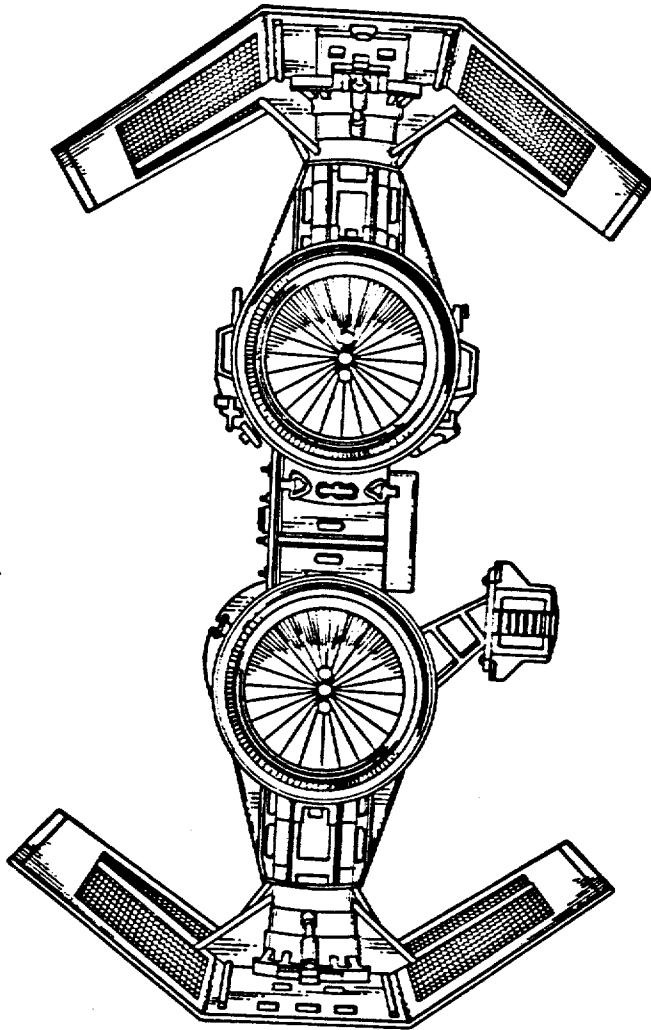

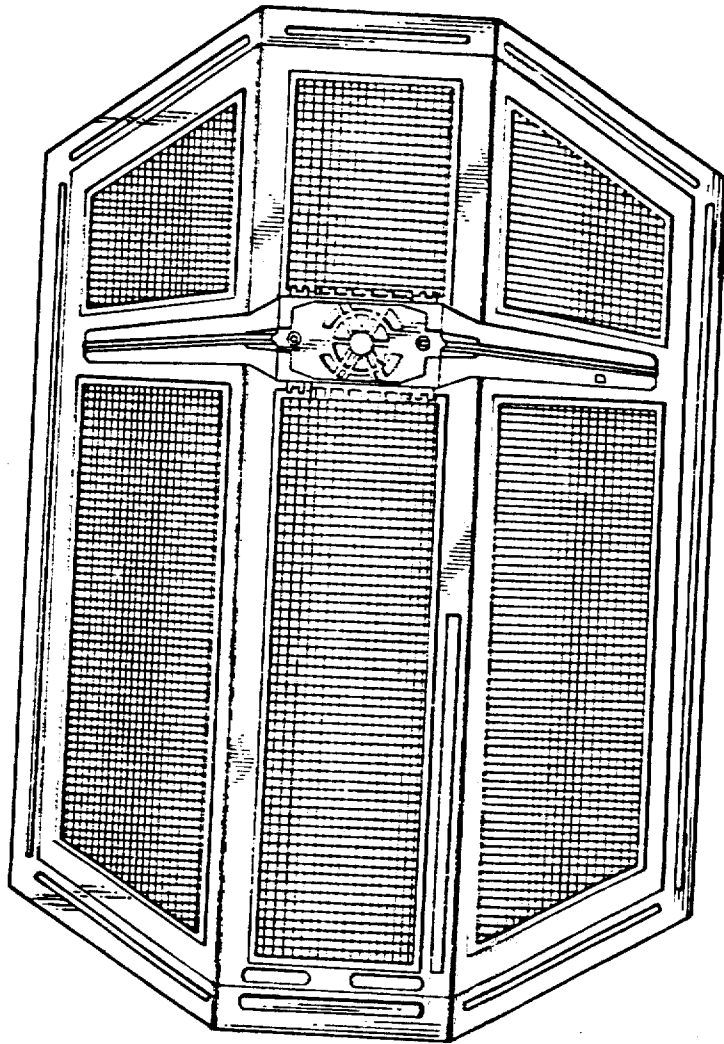
